

## Joshua: Are We There Yet? | Claiming Mountains | Joshua 14

- 1. Thinking back over the series in Joshua, what repeating themes have you noticed, found interesting or challenging? What have you learned about God and yourself?
- 2. Have a look at Numbers 13:1-3, 26-33, 14:5-9, 24,25 to remind yourself of the story of Joshua, Caleb and the spies, before reading Joshua 14.
- 3. Caleb repeatedly is described as someone who 'follows God whole-heartedly'. (E.g. Numbers 14:24, Joshua 14:8) What do you understand this to mean? What evidence do we see from Caleb's life?
- 4. Do you know anyone who you would describe as following God wholeheartedly today? What is it about the way they live that makes you say this?
- 5. How did Caleb demonstrate both obedience and faith throughout his life? Discuss the place and importance of both obedience and faith in following Jesus. What Bible verses might you turn to?
- 6. How can fear and adversity challenge our faith and obedience? From your own experience how do you handle fear and adversity? What promises of God do you hold on to in difficult times?
- 7. V 12 Do you find Caleb's request shocking or courageous? Do you have this confidence to claim God's promises? Why/why not?
- 8. Spend some time reading the following promises, or others you think of. What do they teach you about God, how could you apply these promises to your present situation? 1John 1:9, Philippians 4:7, Pslam 1:3, Romans 8:28, Romans 8:38-39.
- 9. What is one promise of God you want to claim and trust God to fulfil for you?
