

Samson: When The Strong Become Weak | Collapsing of Faith | Judges 16:1-22

- 1. When you reflect on the teaching from Sunday, what can you recall that you were encouraged or challenged by? Why was that? What did you learn that was a new insight for you?
- 2. Read together Judges 16:1-3. The phrase 'one day' comes out of the blue after 20 years of leadership, but does it really?
 - a. What do you think is going on for Samson? Why is he so rebellious? Do any contemporary stories come to mind that could start 'one day'?
 - b. What do we learn by looking at this story and other contemporary examples?
- 3. Read together Judges 16:4-22. Share what strikes you about the narrative? What questions does it raise for you? Share with others and hear their thoughts on your question?
 - a. Samson clearly has reduced the value of his dedication to God. He has in some sense forgotten where his gift of strength comes from.
 - i. Share ways in which you can maintain your devotion to God. How can you guard against taking all that God has done in/for/through you for granted?
 - b. Samson struggled with boundaries; he couldn't identify when enough was enough.
 - i. Consider areas in which you are struggling in your Christian walk. Share together, offer words of encouragement, and pray for one another.
- 4. Several challenges were made on Sunday by reflecting on scripture. How do the following verses encourage and challenge you personally?
