



To The Disciples (Again) | John 21:1-14

Take time to read John 21:1–14 slowly and reflectively...

1. Why do you think Peter and the disciples went fishing after Jesus' resurrection?
2. How did Jesus reveal Himself to the disciples? Why didn't they recognise Him right away?
3. What's significant about the miraculous catch of fish in this story?
4. What does Jesus preparing breakfast show us about His nature?
5. Why is it important that Jesus met them in their routine rather than a religious setting?
6. Have you experienced a time when your efforts felt like "empty nets"? What did that feel like?
7. Is there something in your life right now that Jesus might be asking you to "cast again"?
8. Do you tend to seek Jesus only in the big, spiritual moments, or do you notice Him in the everyday?
9. How does Jesus' invitation to "come and eat" speak to your experience of grace?
10. The last time Peter stood by a charcoal fire, he failed (John 18:18). What "charcoal fires" in your life might Jesus be wanting to redeem?
11. What's one area where you need to renew your trust in Jesus today?
