



Worship | Revelation 4:2, Revelation 5

1. What does it mean to be “in the Spirit” as John was in Revelation 4:2, and how does that relate to how we approach worship today?
2. Revelation 5 describes Jesus as both the “Lion of Judah” and the “Lamb who was slain.” How do these two images help us understand the character of Jesus in worship?
3. How can we cultivate the mindset that “everything is worship”? What are some practical examples from daily life where worship can be expressed outside of church settings?
4. How does understanding that worship is not about us but about Jesus change our attitude and posture during worship?
5. Romans 5:7–8 highlights God’s love while we were still sinners. How does this deepen our response to Him in worship?
6. What are the challenges of worshipping “with everything” and “in every circumstance,” and how can grace help us overcome these challenges?
7. Revelation 5:11–14 shows a picture of united, heavenly worship. How can our church community reflect that heavenly model more fully?
8. We all stray from God from time to time, its can be difficult to know sometimes, it’s important to try and identify, if we are not worshipping Jesus, then who and/or what are we worshipping?
