1. What stands out to you most from John 20:19-23, and why?
2. Why do you think the disciples had locked the doors? What *"locked doors"* can fear create in our lives today?
3. Jesus' first words to the disciples were, *"Peace be with you."* Why is receiving Christ's peace important before stepping into His mission?
4. What do you think Jesus meant when He said, *"As the Father has sent me, I am sending you"*?
5. In what ways did Jesus bring God's love and truth to people around Him? Which of those ways can we reflect in everyday life?
6. Where has God already placed you to be a witness for Him—at home, work, school, among friends, or in your community?
7. What makes sharing your faith or inviting someone to church feel difficult? How does the promise of the Holy Spirit encourage you?
8. Chris said, *"We are not called to be impressive; we are called to be available."* What could availability to God look like for you this week?
9. Is there one person God may be placing on your heart to pray for, encourage, or invite? What is one practical next step you could take?
10. Spend time praying together: ask God to fill you with His peace and Spirit, and to help each person reach one person with the hope of Jesus.
