Bob S - My Christian faith is all down to the Boy's Brigade.

I was a member of the Boy's Brigade from an early age. Firstly as a Life Boy and later in the main Boy's Brigade company as private and then serving as an officer for a number of years. It was through a BB camp that circumstances arose which led me quite unexpectedly to end up cooking for a camp of 80 boys and officers. This I went on to repeat on a number of occasions. The experience was such a privilege and joy and set me on a new career path. Leaving school, I followed both my father into the printing industry which in all honestly I loathed. The experience of catering for a large camp opened my eyes to the prospect of a career in the hospitality industry and I went on to train as a chef. Subsequently I moved into Catering Management within local government and a senior NHS post. In the late 1980's we moved to Southbourne and ran a Guest house, and I then became Chef/Patron at our restaurant in Southbourne where we served many local Christians. During the later period I suffered two bouts of cancer which eventually took their toll. From printer to caterer. God really does move in a mysterious way.

Sarah S - Wild child meets a wild Jesus

As part of a Christian family I became a Christian at age 7, I slipped away during my teen years and became quite the wild child!

At 18 I found myself in a church in Springbourne and recommitted my life to Jesus that night. At 19 I was baptised in the Holy Spirit alone in my bedroom and then my adventures with Jesus began from setting up and running a Christian youth charity, to being on the mission field in China. I now have the privilege to serve with the mission organisation, Operation Mobilisation where I get to be part of taking the gospel to the least reached people on the planet, which is pretty wild!

Deborah M - Battered, Bruised. Restored, Repaired!

Battered and bruised from a long, unhealthy marriage. I began talking to a God I didn't know and asking for things He wasn't likely to give me. (Money mostly to try and overcome the debt that my then husband had accumulated, which was enormous!)

When the money wasn't coming finally stopped asking for it and simply prayed that if God was real, that He would just help me because my life was such a mess. My circumstances didn't change immediately, but I did! Once I surrendered in prayer by asking only for help I seemed to find the courage to make new choices and finally leave my abusive marriage.

I met Malc soon after, and the first question I asked him was, "Do you believe in God?" After he straightaway told me he did, the rest is history!

Louis S - Struggled. Prayed. Heard.

During my teens, I met people from other churches, who used their bibles to learn about our relationship with God. I bought a bible but could not understand it.

In desperation I prayed "God if You want me to understand this, You have got to help me!!!"

Suddenly there was an explosion all around me, but without pain. I know that this was God The Holy Spirit, and immediately, my bible made sense and for many years, this has deepened. I now know that I will meet Jesus one day, because I trust in Him and what He has done for me.

Maureen B - Weekly services, Youth rally, Jesus came alive, 70 years loved.

Charlotte D - God in the distance. God by my side.

Always went to church with my family

when I was growing up. Knew God but felt he was at distance. (Down the garden!). Moved away to train as a nurse and got involved with a lively church. Made a commitment to follow Jesus at a Nicky Cruz rally in Painton. Entered into a personal relationship with God. Life has had its ups and downs and indeed disappointments, but he has walked with me through the good and the bad. In recent years my relationship has strengthened, due to circumstances, and I have finally let go and surrendered totally to God.

Alan G - Mocked Christians, found faith in 1991, never worried again since.

I had always envied other people who were Christians and had amazing faith. At the same I was derisive of Christians, called them Happy Clappers and Bible Bashers. But when I was 41, I went to a local charismatic church because I felt something was missing in my life. As we were singing Above All, and got to the words "You lived to die, rejected and alone, Like a rose, trampled on the ground" my eyes welled up with tears and I sat down and cried, oblivious to the rest of the congregation. An assistant minister took me aside to pray the repentance and acceptance of Jesus in my life. I even remember the date 14th April 1991. From that day onwards I have never worried about anything happening, even through two bouts of cancer.

Brenda W - Inherited faith, walking the road, will arrive at home.

I had no Damascus Road experience as I inherited my Christianity from my family. I have been walking the road ever since and will arrive when I get home.

Duncan R - Scared of dying, given eternal life.

When I grew up during the 70s the IRA were always on the TV news with their bombing campaigns on the Mainland. It stirred in me a real fear of death. It was two questions that changed this fear and changed my life. "If you were to die tonight would you go to heaven?" And "if you were to die and stand before God and he were to ask you "why should I let you into heaven" what would you say?" The best answer I was given was from the Bible in Johns gospel.

My purpose in writing is simply this: that you who believe in God's Son will know beyond the shadow of a doubt that you have eternal life, It is this belief and hope that empowers me to work in a hospital with patients of all stages of life.

I was in the 6th form at a boy's school and a classmate invited some boys to a church youth group BBQs with the promise that there would be girls there. I started to go to the group and several months later I gave my life to Jesus.

Life was tough growing up for a number of reasons. My parents showed no signs of faith, though I discovered after her death that my mother had been baptised as an adult. At age 15, having moved into town 3 years before, as we lost our tied accommodation in the hospital when my father died, I started going to a local Anglican church youth group, mainly to be as disruptive as possible! One day the curate spoke on the man at the pool of Bethesda: 'Do you want to be healed?' To my surprise I found myself standing and discovered friendship with Jesus. Without that rescue life would have been very different. God also some years later brought Malc to faith: he teaches me so much about God's love. Ron D - Joined Boys' Brigade Wanted Fun & Friendships Found Jesus

When I was 13 a friend at School invited me to his Boys' Brigade Company. That invitation has greatly influenced my life. Even as a late starter I soon became immersed in the BB and all its activities and eventually it took over a big portion of my life when I became a young leader. At the same time, I believed in God but had not experienced or accepted his Son as my Lord and Savior. However, I grew in knowledge of Jesus through running BB Bible Classes and studying. It was around the early 1980's that I started to understand that you had to make a personal decision to follow Jesus and to accept him as your Savior and that he died on the cross for my sins. I was greatly encouraged by several outstanding Christian BB leaders. There were many evangelistic events during this period, and I went to several of them. I never had the courage to respond to the invitations and calling to get to know Jesus personally and never went forward when challenged to do so even though I knew it was what God wanted me to do.

1983 was the Centenary of the founding of the Boys' Brigade and many special events had been arranged for that year to celebrate the occasion. It was at a large BB rally in Central Hall Westminster that a speaker by the name of Eric Delve was challenging the young people and leaders to become real followers of Jesus that at last I had the real courage to stand up and respond to what I had believed for a long time. I will always remember that evening as a young lad that had suffered my football referring said "well done Ref" as I went forward!!

Mavis H - Upbringing Anglican, christened, confirmed. Powerful testimony, baptism. Religion became relationship.

Geoff H - Experienced grief -Jesus gave my soul relief.

Timothy A - What's the Holy Spirit? Got filled!

My parents were committed to the Christadelphian faith, my father was a speaker and leader of the church and I with two brothers and one sister, went to Christadelphian meetings, Sunday school and youth gatherings. My Grandparents on both sides were Christadelphians and as far as we know their parents were also Christadelphians.

I was challenged by my middle brother who was leaving the faith, to believe something different about the Holy Spirit. I had no one to ask as all my friends and family were Christadelphian and there was no internet in those days and I did not know what books to turn to.
